























Baija Mai Kote Patil - Sai Baba treated her as His elder sister and equivalent to mother. She was









Sankaracharya established 4 Peethams (Mutt/Peeth) at 4 directions of our country.


- 1. **Poorvamnaya Shri Govardhana Peetham** (Rigveda Eastern Monastery), which is located in Puri, Odisha

- 3. **Uttaramnaya Shri Jyotish Peetham** (Atharva Veda Northern Monastery), which is located in Joshimath, Uttarakhand
- 4. **Dakshinamnaya Shri Sarada Peetham** (Yajurveda Southern Monastery), which is located at Shringeri, Karnataka






